Purpose Statement

To provide faith-based organizations with information and skilled training which is feasible, relevant, timely, and viable in addressing the safety needs of our church communities by ensuring a safe worship environment through planning, prevention, preparation and prayer.

Who should attend these seminars?

The program is designed to train those who serve in leadership and laymen's positions in the church and are directly responsible for managing any church service or special event. The team of facilitators have created an integrated curriculum that includes, parking lot attendants, facilities personnel, IT departments, media staff, counselors, ministerial staff, church safety team and leadership to ensure the church takes a coordinated approach to managing the safety of the congregation.

Does the seminar conduct active shooter exercises?

Yes. The instructors along with the assistance of a team of seasoned law enforcement veterans, conduct live training exercises for members who serve on the church safety teams and any other capacity associated with managing the congregation.

How can my church host a training seminar and what is the cost?

Churches who wish to host a seminar would simply contact the class coordinator and reserve a date. For classes to be held a minimum of thirty six (36) paid students must participate. The host church will receive three (3) scholarships for serving as a host location. The church must be able to designate at least six break out rooms for training exercises. There is no cost to host the training. A standard registration fee of \$35 is assessed by the college for certification purposes for the participants.

Do I receive professional development credit for participating in the course?

Yes, sixteen hours of continuing education credit is awarded for attending both seminars.



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


